Called to Order at 12:01pm – Quorum established

Ryan moved to approve the July minutes, Robin 2nd, all in favor of approval.

PODA – should reach out to Health Dept. Linda & Councilmember Pepper met with the employee and the code states we can reuse the cups. We can make suggestions on the disconnect between cups, recycling, events, etc. Robin mentioned going to the music festival FloydFest in VA where there were no plastic cups whatsoever. A nice, commemorative aluminum tumbler had to be purchased for \$15 at the beginning of the event and used throughout for draft pours. All other purchased beverages were in cans. There were recycling bins EVERYWHERE for those and single use plastic bottles.

Director Webster will check to see if some of the bins have been stolen, and more can be ordered. Rowan had previously spoken to city employees who expressed concern that some may have been stolen.

Bill was passed over the summer to do away with pouring beer into cups at Haddad Riverfront Park. The Mayor told Councilmember Pepper there would be recycling at the 2025 Regatta.

Robin moved to approve the report, 2nd by Ryan, all in favor to accept.
