- WHEREAS:** Sheets graduated from Charleston High School in 1969 and earned a Bachelor's Degree in Sociology and Urban Affairs from Morris Harvey College in 1973, and
- WHEREAS:** Sheets was a proud and prominent LGBTQ+ activist, former manager of the Tap Room, founder of the annual Pride Picnic at Coonskin Park, President of the Prime Timers, and a founding member and vice-president of the Living AIDS Memorial Garden; and
- WHEREAS:** Inspired by the civic service of his mother, Sheets was elected to Charleston City Council three times to represent Ward 8, where he was known for his quiet strength, his conscience-led votes, and his dedication to equity and community wellbeing; and
- WHEREAS:** Sheets championed causes ranging from LED street lighting and public health advocacy to support for the voices of underserved residents, always seeking to elevate both expert insight and lived experience; and
- WHEREAS:** Sheets was a mentor to non-profit leaders, a guide for new Council Members, and a steady moral compass through times of challenge and change; and
- WHEREAS:** His empathy extended to even the smallest among us—as he once encouraged the adoption of black cats, reminding us to look past appearances and embrace those overlooked or misunderstood; and
- WHEREAS:** Sheets leaves behind a legacy of compassion, civic engagement, and tireless advocacy for justice, inclusion, and community; and

After duly being published as required, the Mayor declared the floor open for a Public Hearing for Bill No. 8056 - Bill No. 8056 - Authorizing the design, acquisition and construction of certain extensions, additions, betterments and improvements to the existing sewerage system of The City of Charleston; authorizing the issuance of not more than \$30,000,000 in aggregate principal amount of Sewerage System Revenue Bonds. No person from the public spoke in reference to the Public Hearing. The Mayor declared the Public Hearing CLOSED.
2. After duly being published as required, the Mayor declared the floor open for a Public Hearing for Bill No. 8057 - A Bill with respect to approving the Magazine Branch Sanitary Sewer Replacement and Rehabilitation Project. No person from the public spoke in reference to the Public Hearing. The Mayor declared the Public Hearing CLOSED.

COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

Councilmember Jenkins, Chair of the Council Committee on Finance, submitted the following reports:

1. Your committee on Finance has had under consideration the following resolution, and reports the same to Council with the recommendation that Resolution No. 25-055 be adopted.
 - a. Resolution No. 25-055 - A resolution supplementing Ordinance No. 8056, passed by the Council of The City of Charleston, West Virginia, on June 16, 2025; which supplemented Ordinance No. 4423 passed by the Council of The City of Charleston, West Virginia, on March 6, 1989, as supplemented by Ordinance No. 4506 passed by the Council on November 6, 1989, by Ordinance No. 4954 passed by the Council on May 3, 1993, by Ordinance No. 6276 passed by the Council on September 3, 1996, by Ordinance No. 6349 passed by the Council on June 2, 1997, by Ordinance No. 6532 passed by the Council on November 16, 1998, by Ordinance No. 6544 passed by the Council on February 1, 1999, by Ordinance No. 6670 passed by the Council on February 5, 2001, by Ordinance No. 6777 passed by the Council on March 19, 2001, by Ordinance No. 6948 passed by the Council on November 4, 2002, by Ordinance No. 6977 passed by the Council on May 19, 2003, by Ordinance No. 7132 passed by the Council on March 7, 2005, by Ordinance No. 7490 passed by the Council on September 6, 2011, by Ordinance No. 7560 passed by the Council on February 19, 2013, by Ordinance No. 7680 passed by the Council on February 16, 2016, and by Ordinance No. 7866, passed by the Council of The City of Charleston, West Virginia, on February 18, 2020; authorizing the design, acquisition and construction of certain extensions, additions, betterments and improvements to the existing sewerage system of The City of Charleston; authorizing the issuance of not more than \$30,000,000 in aggregate principal amount of Sewerage System Revenue Bonds, in one or more series as designated in a supplemental resolution, of The City of Charleston, the proceeds of which, shall be used, along with other funds and moneys of, or available to, The City of Charleston which may be lawfully expended for such purposes, to permanently finance the cost of such design, acquisition and construction, to fund reserve accounts for such bonds and to pay other costs in connection therewith; providing for the rights and remedies of and security for the registered owners of such bonds; and adopting other provisions related thereto.

WHEREAS, the Council (the “Council”) of The City of Charleston, West Virginia (the “City”), on June 16, 2025, adopted Ordinance No. 8056, (the “Ordinance”), authorizing the issuance of The City of Charleston Sewerage System Revenue Bonds, in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$30,000,000, in one or more series, to permanently finance the cost of design, acquisition and construction of certain extensions, additions, betterments and improvements to the sewerage system of the City (the “Project”);

WHEREAS, capitalized terms used herein and not otherwise defined herein shall have the same meaning set forth in the Ordinance when used herein;

WHEREAS, the Ordinance provided for the issuance by the City of its Sewerage System Revenue Bonds, Series 2025 A, in the aggregate principal amount of not more than \$30,000,000 (the “Series 2025 A Bonds”), for the purposes of paying a portion of the costs of acquisition and construction of additions, betterments and improvements to the System, capitalizing interest on the Series 2025 A Bonds, if any, funding a reserve account for the Series 2025 A Bonds and paying costs of issuance thereof, all in accordance with Chapter 16, Article 13 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended (the “Act”);

WHEREAS, the Ordinance, pursuant to Section 6 of the Act, directed the City Clerk to publish an abstract of the Ordinance (the “Abstract”), together with a notice that the Ordinance has been adopted, that the City contemplates the issuance of the Series 2025 A Bonds as described in the Ordinance and that any person interested may appear before the Council upon a certain day and present protests (the “Notice”);

WHEREAS, the Ordinance required that the Abstract and Notice be published as a Class II legal advertisement in the Charleston Gazette-Mail, a newspaper published and of general circulation in the City, and the first publication of such Abstract and Notice was to be not less than ten (10) days before the date set by the Ordinance and the Notice at which interested persons may appear before the Council and present protests, and the last publication of such Abstract and Notice was to be prior to said date set by the Ordinance and the Notice;

WHEREAS, the Ordinance and the Notice provided for a public hearing to be held at 7:00 p.m., prevailing time, on July 7, 2025, in Council Chambers in City Hall; and

WHEREAS, the Council deems it essential and desirable that this resolution (the “Supplemental Resolution”) be adopted, that the Ordinance shall be placed into effect, and that other matters relating to the Bonds be herein provided for.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHARLESTON:

Section 1. It is hereby found and determined that:

(A) The Abstract and Notice were duly published in the Charleston Gazette-Mail, a newspaper published and of general circulation in the City, with the first publication thereof being on June 26, 2025, which date is not less than ten (10) days before the day set by the Ordinance and the Notice for the public hearing, at which interested persons may appear before the Council and present protests and suggestions and, the second being on July 3, 2025, which publication thereof being prior to said date set by the Ordinance and the Notice for the public hearing, and the Affidavit of Publication reflecting such publications is incorporated herein by reference;

(B) In accordance with the Ordinance and the Notice, the City Clerk has maintained in his office a certified copy of the Ordinance for review by interested persons during the regular office hours of such office;

(C) In Council Chambers, City Hall, Charleston, West Virginia, on July 7, 2025, at 7:00 p.m.

prevailing time, in accordance with the Ordinance and the Notice, the Council met for the purpose of hearing protests and suggestions regarding whether the Ordinance should be put into effect and heard all protests and suggestions with regard thereto;

(D) At the public hearing, no significant reasons were presented that would require modification or amendment of the Ordinance and no written protest with regard thereto was filed by 30 percent or more of the freeholders of the City; and

(E) The Ordinance shall be put into effect as of the date hereof and the Series 2025 A Bonds contemplated thereby shall be issued, all as provided in the Ordinance and this Supplemental Resolution.

Section 2. This Supplemental Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption hereof.

Councilmember Jenkins added that the resolution is related to the Magazine Branch Sewer Improvement Project. Once the total cost of the project is known for the bonds, another resolution to approve that price will come before Council.

Councilmember Jenkins moved to approve the resolution. Councilmember Ceperley seconded the motion. With members present recorded thereon as voting unanimously in the affirmative, the Mayor declared Resolution No. 25-055.

2. Your committee on Finance has had under consideration the following resolution, and reports the same to Council with the recommendation that Resolution No. 25-056 be adopted.

Resolution No. 25-056 - Authorizing the Mayor to enter into a Lease Agreement with Star USA Federal Credit Union for the right of way on the north side of Cantley Drive approximately forty-four (44) feet wide and four hundred fifty (450) feet long.

Now Therefore, Be it Resolved by the Council of the City of Charleston, West Virginia:

That the Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a Lease Agreement with Star USA Federal Credit Union for the right of way on the north side of Cantley Drive approximately forty-four (44) feet wide and four hundred fifty (450) feet long, which is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Councilmember Jenkins added that additional services from previous contracts include trash removal and tree trimming. When the work is completed, liens are placed on the property.

Councilmember Jenkins added that the resolution is for the renewal of a thirty-year lease so that the business can place signs on a section of a small right of way. The business will also do drainage repairs.

Councilmember Jenkins moved to approve the resolution. Councilmember Ceperley seconded the motion. With members present recorded thereon as voting unanimously in the affirmative, the Mayor declared Resolution No. 25-056.

3. Your committee on Finance has had under consideration the following resolution, and reports the same to Council with the recommendation that Resolution No. 25-057 be adopted.

- b. Resolution No. 25-057 - Authorizing the Mayor or City Manager to grant permanent easements from the City to the Charleston Sanitary Board and to enter into an Agreement for the re-routing of a 24-inch sewer main pipe on City property in order to accommodate renovations to Charleston Fire Department Station No. 4, where the estimated cost of re-routing the sewer main is \$54,578.30.

Now Therefore, Be it Resolved by the Council of the City of Charleston, West Virginia:

That the Mayor or City Manager are hereby authorized to:

Grant permanent easements from the City to the Charleston Sanitary Board for the re-routing of a 24-inch sewer main pipe on City property in order to accommodate renovations to Charleston Fire Department Station No. 4, which are attached hereto as Exhibit A; and Enter into an Agreement with the Charleston Sanitary Board to reimburse it for the actual costs of re-routing the sewer main pursuant to the CSB's low-bid contract, where the estimated cost of re-routing the sewer main is \$54,578.30, but the actual costs may be less than or greater than that amount. A draft of the Agreement and estimated cost of the project are attached hereto as Exhibit B.

Councilmember Jenkins added that the resolution is related to the upgrades to CFD stations. A sewer main pipe needs to be moved to complete the renovations for Station 4.

With members present recorded thereon as voting unanimously in the affirmative, Mayor Goodwin declared Resolution No. 25-057 as adopted.

4. Your committee on Finance has had under consideration the following resolution, and reports the same to Council with the recommendation that Resolution No. 25-058 be adopted.

Resolution No. 25-058 - Authorizing the Mayor or City Manager to enter into a contract with Claxton & Sons to purchase various classes of Portland Cement on an as-needed basis at the prices listed in Exhibit A, pursuant to a competitive bidding process.

Be it Resolved by the Council of the City of Charleston, West Virginia:

That the Mayor or City Manager is authorized to enter into a contract with Claxton & Sons to purchase various classes of Portland Cement on an as-needed basis at the prices listed in Exhibit A, pursuant to a competitive bidding process.

Councilmember Jenkins added that this is the annual approval to lock in rates for the year.

With members present recorded thereon as voting unanimously in the affirmative, Mayor Goodwin declared Resolution No. 25-058 as adopted.

That the Mayor or City Manager is authorized to enter into a contract with Martin Marietta Materials, Inc., to purchase various classes and sizes of aggregate stone at the prices listed in Exhibit A, pursuant to a competitive bidding process.

Councilmember Jenkins added that this is the annual approval to lock in rates for the year.

With members present recorded thereon as voting unanimously in the affirmative, Mayor Goodwin declared Resolution No. 25-059 as adopted.

6. Your committee on Finance has had under consideration the following resolution, and reports the same to Council with the recommendation that Resolution No. 25-060 be adopted.

Resolution No. 25-060 - Authorizing the Mayor or City Manager to enter into an agreement with American Asphalt of West Virginia, LLC., to purchase various asphalt at the prices listed in Exhibit A, where the prices were determined pursuant to a competitive bidding process conducted by the State of West Virginia.

Be it Resolved by the Council of the City of Charleston, West Virginia:

That the Mayor or City Manager is authorized to enter into an agreement with American Asphalt of West Virginia, LLC., to purchase various asphalt at the prices listed in Exhibit A, where the prices were determined pursuant to a competitive bidding process conducted by the State of West Virginia.

Councilmember Jenkins added that this is the annual approval to lock in rates for the year, which will be threw a State contract.

With members present recorded thereon as voting unanimously in the affirmative, Mayor Goodwin declared Resolution No. 25-060 as adopted.

7. Your committee on Finance has had under consideration the following resolution, and reports the same to Council with the recommendation that Resolution No. 25-061 be adopted.

Resolution No. 25-061 - Authorizing the Mayor or City Manager to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with other participating agencies comprising the Metro Drug Enforcement Network Team (MDENT), consistent with Attachment A hereto, that assists the Charleston area offices of the Drug Enforcement Administration, the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives to achieve maximum cooperation in combined law enforcement efforts to address drug and related violent crime offenses in Charleston and surrounding communities. The MOU is in effect for a one-year period starting July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026.

Be it Resolved by the Council of the City of Charleston, West Virginia:

That the Mayor or City Manager is authorized to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with other participating agencies comprising the Metro Drug Enforcement Network Team (MDENT), consistent with Attachment A hereto, that assists the Charleston area offices of the Drug Enforcement Administration, the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives to achieve maximum cooperation in combined law enforcement efforts to address drug and related violent crime offenses in Charleston and surrounding communities. The MOU is in effect for a one-year period starting July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026.

Councilmember Jenkins added that the resolution is the same as the one that was approved last year. It guides how MDENT is run and manes the City as the fiscal agent for the group.

With members present recorded thereon as voting unanimously in the affirmative, Mayor Goodwin declared Resolution No. 25-061 as adopted.

8. Your committee on Finance has had under consideration the following resolution, and reports the same to Council with the recommendation that Resolution No. 25-062 be adopted.

Resolution No. 25-062 - Authorizing the Mayor or City Manager to purchase office furniture, supplies, and equipment for the CARE Office from Stationers, Inc., with a total cost of \$57,898.66, where the supplies and pricing are provided in a competitively sourced statewide contract (SWC-Office23), and where the funding is provided by a CIT grant intended for the purchase of such supplies.

Be it Resolved by the Council of the City of Charleston, West Virginia:

That the Mayor or City Manager is authorized to purchase office furniture, supplies, and equipment for the CARE Office from Stationers, Inc., with a total cost of \$57,898.66, where the supplies and pricing are provided in a competitively sourced statewide contract, and where the funding is provided by a CIT grant intended for the purchase of such supplies.

Councilmember Jenkins added that the purchase will be made with grant funding.

With members present recorded thereon as voting unanimously in the affirmative, Mayor Goodwin declared Resolution No. 25-062 as adopted.

9. Your committee on Finance has had under consideration the following resolution, and reports the same to Council with the recommendation that Resolution No. 25-063 be adopted.

Resolution No. 25-063 - Authorizing the Mayor or City Manager to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with the United Way of Central West Virginia, Inc. relating to the administration and distribution of opioid settlement funds to local public entities under the terms set forth in the attached Exhibit A.

Now Therefore, Be it Resolved by the Council of the City of Charleston, West Virginia:

That the Mayor or City Manager is hereby authorized to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with the United Way of Central West Virginia, Inc. relating to the administration and distribution of opioid settlement funds to local public entities under the terms set forth in the attached Exhibit A.

Councilmember Jenkins added that the MOU allows United Way to disperse settlement funds to local organizations.

Councilmember Gianola abstained from voting due to a potential pecuniary interest.

With members present recorded thereon as voting in the majority as affirmative, Mayor Goodwin declared Resolution No. 25-063 as adopted.

10. Your committee on Finance has had under consideration the following resolution, and reports the same to Council with the recommendation that Resolution No. 25-064 be adopted.

Resolution No. 25-064 - Authorizing the Mayor or City Manager to enter into a one-year contract with West Virginia Demolition, Inc. with the option additional years, in the amount of \$4.75 per square foot and \$1.00 for emergency call out fees, for demolition services, where the price was determined as the result of a competitive bidding process.

Be it Resolved by the Council of the City of Charleston, West Virginia:

That the Mayor or City Manager is authorized to enter into a one-year contract with West Virginia Demolition, Inc. with the option additional years, in the amount of \$4.75 per square foot and \$1.00 for emergency call out fees, for demolition services, where the price was determined as the result of a competitive bidding process.

Councilmember Jenkins added that the chosen vendor's call out fee made it the lowest bid.

With members present recorded thereon as voting unanimously in the affirmative, Mayor Goodwin declared Resolution No. 25-064 as adopted.

11. Your committee on Finance has had under consideration the following bill, and reports the same to Council with the recommendation that Bill No. 8057 do pass.

Bill No. 8057 - AN ORDINANCE WITH RESPECT TO APPROVING THE MAGAZINE BRANCH SANITARY SEWER REPLACEMENT AND REHABILITATION PROJECT.

WHEREAS, the Sanitary Board is pursuing a sewer replacement and rehabilitation project in the Magazine Branch area of the City of Charleston which is necessary to correct older, failing sewer collection lines and is necessary for the health and welfare of the citizens of the City of Charleston (the “Magazine Branch Project”); and

WHEREAS, Chapter 24, Article 2, Section 11(I) of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, provides that the Council of the City of Charleston shall read the proposed construction and the proposed rates, fees and charges at two meetings, with at least two weeks between each meeting, with a public hearing to be conducted with or following the second reading, and that enactment of the proposed construction and the proposed rates, fees and charges shall follow an affirmative vote of the governing body and shall be effective no sooner than forty-five days following the action of the governing body; and

WHEREAS, the Magazine Branch Project consists of two separate Phases and consists of work including the planning, design, acquisition and construction of certain extensions, additions, betterments and improvements to its existing sewerage system, including but not limited to, the replacement and or rehabilitation of existing sewers in the areas of: Phase 1: Garrison Avenue (between Edgewood Drive and terminus); Atlantic Street; Amaron Street; Beulah Street; Pacific Street; Crestlin Drive; Earle Street; Spreigel Drive; Melrose Drive; Charmac Drive; Wood Road; Summit Drive; and Edgewood Drive; and Phase 2: Garrison Avenue (between Crescent Road and Edgewood Drive) and Rockaway Road; provided, that the work will further include all necessary appurtenances; further provided, that to the extent that funds remain available, extensions, additions, betterments and improvements to the remaining portion of the existing sewer system; and

WHEREAS, the Sanitary Board is not proposing an increase in its rates, fees and charges to support the Magazine Branch Project, thus the rates, fees and charges previously approved by the Council of the City of Charleston for the Sanitary Board will be charged;

Now, therefore, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Charleston, West Virginia:

Section 1. That the construction of the Sanitary Board’s Magazine Branch Sewer Replacement and Rehabilitation Project consisting of two separate Phases and consisting of work including the planning, design, acquisition and construction of certain extensions, additions, betterments and improvements to its existing sewerage system, including but not limited to, the replacement and or rehabilitation of existing sewers in the areas of: Phase 1: Garrison Avenue (between Edgewood Drive and terminus); Atlantic Street; Amaron Street; Beulah Street; Pacific Street; Crestlin Drive; Earle Street; Spreigel Drive; Melrose Drive; Charmac Drive; Wood Road; Summit Drive; and Edgewood Drive; and Phase 2: Garrison Avenue (between Crescent Road and Edgewood Drive) and Rockaway Road; provided, that the work will further include all necessary appurtenances; further provided, that to the extent that funds remain available, extensions, additions, betterments and improvements to the remaining portion of the existing sewer system is hereby authorized and approved; and

Section 2. That, in accordance with the requirements of Chapter 24, Article 2, Section 11 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, the approval of the proposed construction shall be effective no sooner than 45 days from the date of said approval; and

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon adoption.

Councilmember Jenkins added that the bill authorizes the Charleston Sanitary Board to proceed with the Magazine Branch Sewer Rehabilitation Project.

Councilmember Jenkins moved to approve the bill. Councilmember Ceperley seconded the motion.

NEW BILLS

Introduced by Councilmember Larry Moore
