A constituent of Ward 15 has recently reached out with some difficulty they have been having with parking Larchwood Road. The family relies on the KRT handicap van service to attend medical appointments. Illegal parking at the dead end of Larchwood prevents the KRT van from turning around safely, causing a hardship for the family. The specific location in question is the gravel wide spot in the road directly across from 1219 Larchwood Road. Matt Heartline has informed me that an ordinance already exists which would allow for the placement of no parking signs, and would only need the approval of this body for the City to be able to place the requested signs which will, hopefully, alleviate the hardship currently faced by this family. I would humbly request that the Planning Streets and Traffic Committee approve the placements of no parking signs at the dead end of Larchwood Road, across from 1219 Larchwood Road.

Sec. 114-559. - Stopping, standing or parking prohibited in specified places.

(a) No person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or official traffic control device, in any of the following places:

- (19) In a turnaround, including, but not limited to, Hammerheads, three-point sides, cul-de-sacs, and three-point wyes.

Bill No. 8068 - A Bill to amend and reenact ordinance 7817 passed by city council June 30, 2019, related to a 15 minute parking zone on Hunters Ridge Road by amending the location to a point 140 feet north of Saddlehorn Road to a point 240 feet north of Saddlehorn Road and amending the Traffic Control Map and Traffic Control File, established by the code of the City of Charleston, West Virginia, two thousand and three, as amended, Traffic Laws, Section 263, Division 2, Article 4, Chapter 114, to conform therewith.

Brent Burton explained that the 15-minute loading zone was established in 2019 to accommodate a person living in one of the units fronting the loading zone. For safety reasons, it's better to move the loading space further away from the curve. The person has since moved out of the unit so there is no opposition to moving the space down the road 100 feet.
